

This CD contains the three reports from a review of liquor licensing legislation in Australia which was undertaken by the National Centre for Education and Training on Addiction (NCETA). These reports are an outcome of a project initiated under the former Ministerial Council on Drug Strategy (MCDS) Cost Shared Funding Model, now administered under the Intergovernmental Committee on Drugs, National Drug Strategy, Cost Shared Funding Model. The project was overseen by South Australia Police which also generously contributed to the report's publication.

The aim of the project was to review, from a law enforcement perspective, the enforcement provisions of the liquor licensing legislation of all Australian states and territories.

The project involved an extensive literature review, a comprehensive examination of each Australian state and territory's liquor licensing legislation and alcohol-related data collection systems as well as interviews with key informants.
