POSITION SUMMARY

The National Centre for Education and Training on Addiction (NCETA) is an internationally recognised Research Centre that works as a catalyst for change in the alcohol and other drugs field. The Centre works to reduce the harms from alcohol and other drugs from prevention through to treatment. NCETA is located within the College of Medicine and Public Health and is part of the Flinders Health and Medical Research Institute (FHMRI) at Flinders University in South Australia. NCETA is home to the Substance Use Research and Evaluation (SURE) Program which conducts analysis, tracking and review of substance use patterns and outcomes for the South Australian Government.

The Research Fellow and Analyst will oversee the Centre's data collections/datasets and provide statistical analysis and advice across various NCETA projects, including the SURE Program. The position will also contribute to project design and implementation, and preparation of reports and peer-reviewed publications.

The Research Fellow and Analyst may also be required to supervise honours and post-graduate research projects and deliver guest lectures.

KEY POSITION RESPONSIBILITIES

The Research Fellow and Analyst is responsible for:

- Overseeing the SURE Program's data collections/datasets
- Maintaining up-to-date knowledge of emerging statistical methods and providing expert advice on the selection and application of appropriate techniques across diverse projects
- Actively contributing to the research project by collaborating with the Research Team to successfully deliver project milestones and Key Performance Indicators, including those set by external funders.
- Independently contributing to the planning and execution of research with the Director, NCETA, team
 members and stakeholders by offering new and innovative ideas, reviewing relevant literature and
 other sources of information, contributing to the writing and editing of grant applications and
 presenting at seminars, meetings and conferences.
- Independently contributing to ethical, high quality and innovative research and evaluation through
 activities such as publishing in recognised high quality journals and assisting the preparation and
 submission of bids for external research funding.
- Playing a lead role in coordinating, planning and executing the project tasks required to collaborate
 with industry partners by preparing project reports, and peer-reviewed papers, and other complex
 documents as required.
- Supervising student research projects (including undergraduate, honours and post-graduate students)
- Disseminating the Centre's research findings via conference, seminar and workshop presentations.
- Establishing and maintaining collaborations within the University, and at State, national and international levels in order to improve research outputs, patents and publications.
- Some out of hours work (including weekends) as well as rural SA, interstate and overseas travel, may be required.
- Any other responsibilities in line with the level of the position as assigned by the Supervisor and/or the University.
